Re: Todd Geib Investigation

Dear Ms. DeAngelis:

Your letter dated October 7, 2009 addressed to Muskegon County Prosecutor, Tony Tague, was forwarded to me for response.

As you are aware, we spoke on several occasions over the last couple of months. I was not able to make a final decision concerning your request for the Michigan State Police to reopen our investigation into the death of Todd Geib until I had a chance to talk with Dr. Joyce DeJong, Chief Medical Examiner for Muskegon County.

The Michigan State Police began its investigation into the disappearance of Todd Geib on June 12, 2005. Over 40 people were interviewed; several searches with canines were conducted in an effort to determine what had happened. Todd's body was found floating in a small lake on July 2, 2005 in Muskegon County.

An autopsy was performed by Dr. Bryan Hunter on July 3.

I have had an opportunity to conduct a thorough review of the Michigan State Police investigation into the disappearance of Todd Geib (complaint [redacted]). Dr. Joyce DeJong and her staff have had a chance to review the autopsy report and findings from Dr. Hunter as well as the findings from Dr. Michael Sikirica.

There is nothing to indicate the death of Todd Geib is anything more than an accidental drowning. To date, the Michigan State Police has not received any evidence that would be contrary and would cause us to reopen the complaint.
